

When passing, always pass on the left because passing on the right may result in an accident involving the bicyclist. The motorist may not see you or believe you are going slower than you actually are on the bicycle.

Similar to how motorists use turn signals, bicyclists should be using hand signals when heading into traffic. If you're turning right, bend your left arm up at a ninety-degree angle. If you're turning left, hold your left arm out straight and to stop hold your left arm down at a ninety-degree angle.

Another issue that faces bicyclists is riding on the sidewalk.

Motorists don't often see the bicyclist on the sidewalk due to the blind spot in their mirrors. There is a solution, however. A bicyclist can get a mirror and this will help them in seeing oncoming traffic. It will prevent accidents and help keep the bicyclist safe.

Finally, the bicyclist should wear a helmet while riding their bicycle. Motorists have a metal frame to protect them from harm, but motorists only have a bicycle. This bicycle makes them more prone to injury and broken limbs. Safety gear such as helmets and pads on elbows and knees can save a life.
