

"After that, it was a no brainer," Bennett said. "They need money for supplies such as newspaper, pet food, grooming and cleaning products, as well as just general upkeep expenses." The shelter has a limited amount of volunteers and is always looking for good assistance. The fundraiser on campus is expected to raise \$500 to \$1000 for the shelter.

Brain Bates, vice president of community service, donated the BMW used in the fundraiser to the fraternity. He's a Charleston driver's education instructor who has several older vehicles at his home, and he sold it to the fraternity for \$1.

Lambda Chi Alpha will offer a sledgehammer to anyone that comes to the event, along with a few surprises. Students are urged not to bring their own items to use on the BMW.

"Our plan is to ask for \$3 per student to have 1 minute go at the car," Bennett said. "However, we don't look to turn anyone away; so even if you don't have \$3, come by and we will be happy to work something out."

Additional donations will be appreciated, and the fraternity will feature an informational table with information about the animal shelter.
